We are thrilled to present our new logo and name **Fischer Sauerländer** – the freshly minted umbrella brand for all our children's books. This will also be the name of our biggest imprint *Fischer Sauerländer*, joined by *Rotfuchs* (a full list of unique and striking titles) and *Duden* (educational books for babies and children up to second grade). In short: There's more than ever to discover ... diving into the catalogue, we're excited to spotlight our special highlights!

Foremost, a non-fiction gem designed for children aged 4 + (but really for everyone): *FREEDOM. A WONDROUS JOURNEY* (page 3) by the brilliant Sybille Hein. Equally compelling is the debut of a new middle grade series that promises to whisk readers away on a journey of fantasy and adventure: *BIRDS OF PARIS* (page 4) is the latest work of widely translated Kathrin Tordasi.

Prepare to be enchanted by our new board books (including several featuring beloved characters like Bobo Dormouse and the Little Badger) and especially by the picture books *LIESELOTTE IN THE RAIN* (page 11), *ENOUGH ROARING*, *LION* (page 12) and *GUINEA PIG DAYS* (page 13). The latter is written by internationally famous writer Cornelia Funke.

There are compelling chapter books, and further in middle grade there's the realistic and funny standalone *WHEN ANDERS ROLLED INTO MY LIFE* (page 26), plus the start of fantastic series *SMARAGOUR* (page 30) for all fans of dragons.

There is a graphic novel which as a memorial for forgotten victims of war: *ANNA* (page 31) is not only heartwrenching and important, it is also based on a true story.

Young Adult readers will find themselves spoiled for choice this season with four brand-new titles worth mentioning: *WHY YOU ARE SILENT* (page 35) by journalist Martin Schäuble exposes sexual abuse in sports, while *LUMINOUS FISH* (page 36) by Filiz Penzkofer is a coming-of-age story that highlights the importance of the decisions we make in life. *FULL DIVE* (page 37), on the other hand, is a suspenseful near future thriller while *LIGA LEXIS* (page 39) is the first of a three-volumed book fantasy – just perfect for book lovers! And last but not least, there are non-fiction-titles for all age groups.
